Types of recreational drugs

(Week 2)

- Opiates Opiates copy the brain's 'feel good' chemicals called endorphins.
 - They bring about a feeling of peaceful euphoria (a feeling of extreme happiness).
- Depressants Sometimes called 'downers'.
 - Depressants slow down the messages in the brain and nervous system. This results in people relaxing and feeling less emotional.
 - Depressants can make people temporarily forget about their problems or poor self-image.
- Stimulants
- Sometimes called 'uppers'.
 - Stimulants speed up the messages to the brain and nervous system.
 - They increase a person's awareness and make them experience things in a more intense way.
